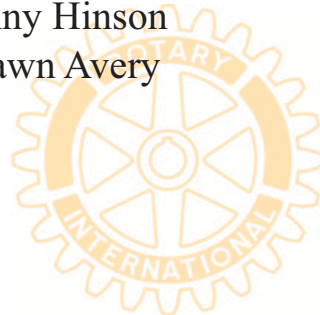

Lackey Free Clinic
Receives District Simplified Grant



Community Service Chair Ned Spencer presented a check in the amount of \$5,400 to Robert Bradley, Director of the Lackey Free

Clinic on December 3rd. Responding to DG Bill Pollard's goal of reducing childhood mortality, our club committed \$3,000 to the clinic in our grant

application. Because of the large number of outstanding applications, District 7600 awarded us \$2,400.

The Lackey Free Clinic was founded in 1995 through the efforts of Dr. and Mrs. Jim Shaw. The first clinic was located in the Rising Sun Baptist Church in York County. In 2003, a new and larger permanent facility opened its doors. By 2007 the clinic was logging more than 5300 patient visits and its operating budget had ballooned to more than a million dollars. Riverside, Sentara and Bon Secour hospital systems have responded with additional resources to meet the growing needs of uninsured and underinsured patients.

Our grant application focused on the needs of expectant and younger mothers who lack the resources to obtain adequate pre- and postnatal care. The local situation is a reflection of national healthcare woes. The United States ranks 27th among industrialized nations in infant mortality. Among the Lackey Free Clinic's patients are about 500 women of childbearing age.

The total cost of the Lackey Free Clinic infant mortality project which projects a target of 250 patients will be \$14,000. Rotary's \$5,000 contribution will pay for a registered nurse to provide healthcare information to these young mothers. Other collaborators will pay the other costs such as educational material.

Earlier this year, our club awarded a \$1,500 grant to the Lackey Free Clinic.

Thanks to Ned Spencer and the Community Service Committee for shepherding this project through the grant process.
