## THE 4-WAY TEST

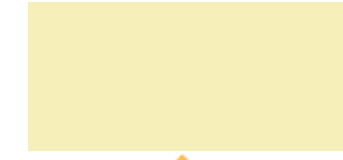

## CLUB MEMBERS VISIT COSTA RICA TO VIEW THE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION AND DEDICATION OF THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT



In early August ten people - seven Rotarians, two spouses, and one daughter - went from the Peninsula to Costa Rica. They were Jim Pierce, Danny Carroll, John and Mary Ellen Frantz, Cap and Linda Neilson, Lanny Hinson, Cathy and Madeline Miller, and Ray Spencer. They spent two days having fun in the mountains, and then two days with our Rotarian friends in Escazú.

The highlight of the trip was the dedication celebration for the water treatment plant at Carmen Lyra School. With a Humanitarian Matching Grant from The Rotary Foundation, our club had partnered with the Escazú Club for this \$35,000.00 project. From this school of 900 children, the newly completed plant takes the sewage and treats it to help protect the nearby river and the town's water supply from contamination. More efficient and requiring less maintenance than other types of systems, the sewage treatment plant at Carmen Lyra is the largest of its type at any school in Costa Rica.
