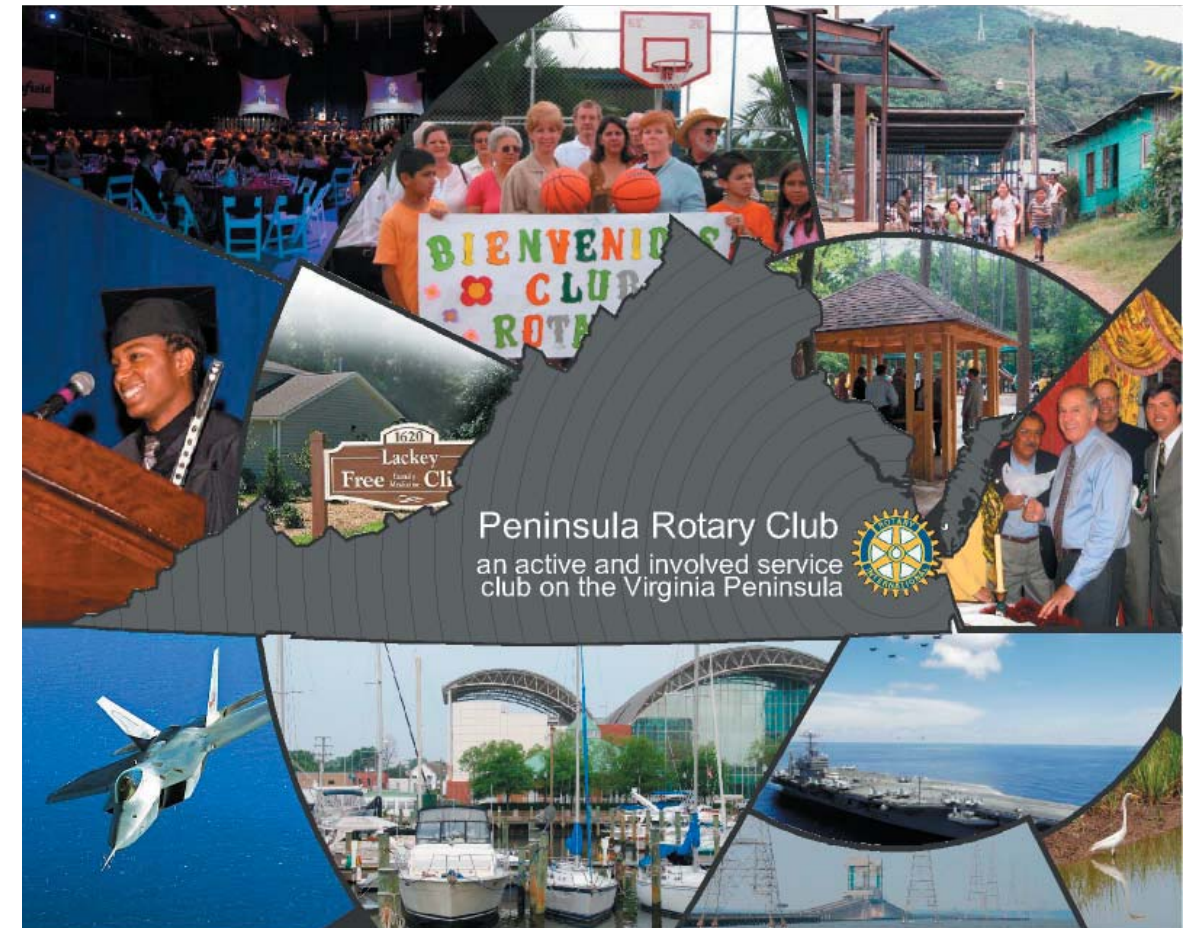

The Seminar was entitled "Follow the Yellow Brick Road: The Path to Successful Leadership." Seminar facilitator was Mr. Greg Richardson (Virginia Peninsula Club). The evening began with a Plenary Session and Keynote Speaker, Mr. Ken Frantz (Newport News Rotary Club) who spoke on "Passion and Purpose: Bridging the Gap to Success." "Breakout sessions included "Achieving Your Dream by Goal-Setting, led by Mr. Cleon Long of the Warwick Club, "How to Become a Credible Leader" led by Mr. Richard Coleman, Executive Director of An Achievable Dream Academy in Newport News, and "How to Sustain a Collaborative Environment"

led by CNU's Head Football Coach, Mr. Matt Kelchner. The evening concluded with a report session from the breakouts of ideas and strategies that students can apply to their lives. Each participant received a Certificate of Completion for their participation in the Seminar.

The CNU Rotaract Club is entering its fourth year and members are involved in many other service projects and programs on and off campus, including international service in Ecuador. Led this year by Seniors, Tanairis Medina and Ashley Barmer, the Club promotes Rotary and its principles to the CNU community.

The Leadership Seminar is named in honor of Dr. Richard Summerville, former Provost of CNU. He inspired faculty, staff and students through his 27 years at CNU and his leadership and influence contributed significantly to the successes and transformation of CNU into a leading university. Personifying the 4 Way Test, he also provides the same wisdom and leadership to the Rotary Club of the Virginia Peninsula where he served in many capacities since joining the Club in 1980, including President of the Club.

The Summerville Seminar is supported by 5 Rotary Clubs: City Center, Newport News, Oyster Point, Virginia Peninsula and Warwick.

## RI President John Kenny's May Message: Rotary will always be there to help.

Shortly after the earthquake hit Haiti in January, Rotarians began making phone calls and sending e-mails to discuss how they could help. When Rotary International posted its first story on Rotary's immediate relief efforts, Rotarians took this discussion online. The very first comment about the story expressed what so many Rotarians were thinking: "If they begin sending Rotarians over to help in any way, please let me know if I can help." This plea was multiplied over the following days on Rotary's website and our social media pages. Rotarians also reported what they were doing: collecting thousands of dollars to fund ShelterBoxes and Aquaboxes, contributing to Rotary's Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund, and organizing ways to transport food, supplies, and medical personnel to the devastated country. On the ground in and around Haiti, Rotarians were also busy. Local Rotarians helped distribute the ShelterBoxes to some of those left homeless. Rotarian Claude Surena, a physician, took 100 injured earthquake victims into his home, which he managed to turn into a makeshift hospital despite the damage it had sustained. District 7020 established a relief fund, flew in planes loaded with medical supplies, and strategized to provide assistance in the weeks following the disaster.

And it is in those weeks – and months and even years – that Rotary can make its greatest contribution. Rotary is not a disaster relief agency, but we are very good at long-term recovery. After all the media attention dies down, Rotary will still be there on the ground – in Haiti's case, with 17 local clubs and thousands of willing partner clubs. If Rotary's recovery efforts in Bangladesh, Honduras, Indonesia, and countless other countries are any indication, Rotarians will be in Haiti long after public interest has faded and the media have moved on.

In this month's Global Outlook, you can learn more about Rotary's success in helping communities and countries rebuild after a disaster – not only replacing what was lost but making it better as well. The Rotarian passion for helping those in need, combined with our perseverance and grassroots presence, will continue to bring hope to those whose lives have been torn apart by disaster.

Our response to the tragedy in Haiti manifests Rotary's concern and desire to help those less fortunate and offers evidence of what Rotary does best: give service. Thank you all for what you are doing.

### THE 4-WAY TEST

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The 4-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test asks:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
