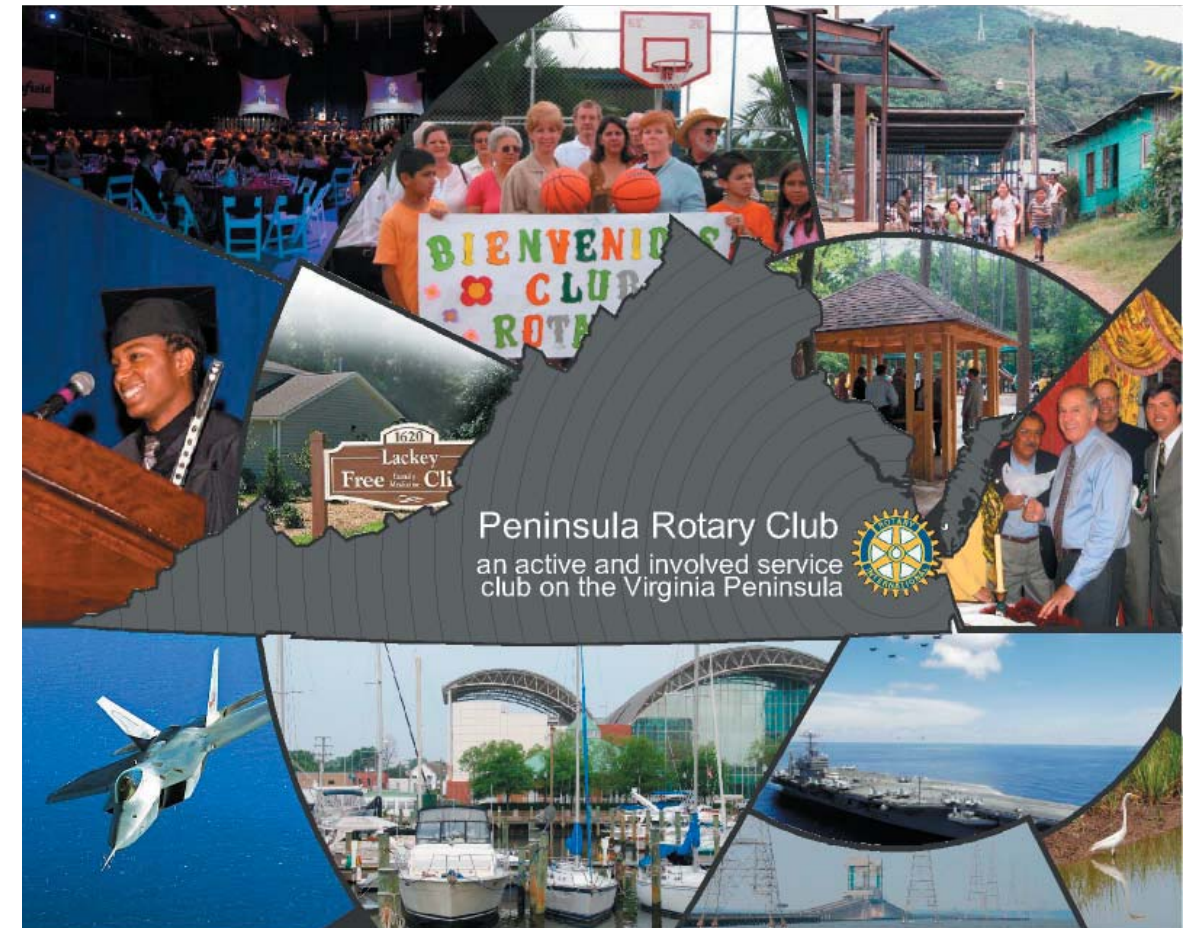

THE ANNUAL CAREER DAY FOCUSES ON "CREATING A LIFE YOU LOVE"



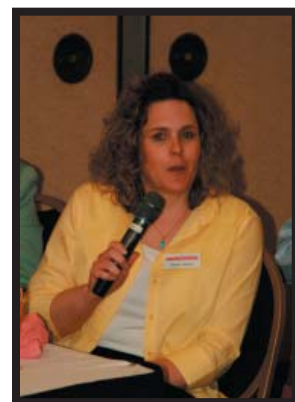
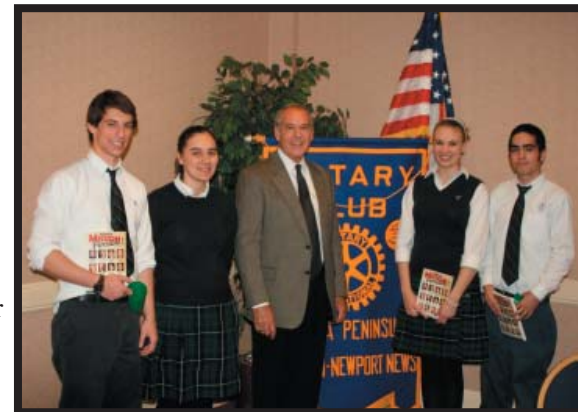
In this tough economy, questions about career paths, career preparation and issues the real world job market faces were on the minds of members of the Peninsula Catholic High School Interact Club at the Annual Career Day, held April 28th. As a part of Vocational Service, our Career Day brings together Club members and high school students to talk about making good choices on the way to selecting careers.

Greg Richardson was in his familiar role of Facilitator for the day. He provided excellent commentary, advice for the Interactors and acted as moderator for the Q&A session. In preparation for participating in Career Day, Interact Club members submitted questions in advance and in the time allotted, many of these questions were

presented. Club members, as well as special guests, were asked to respond to student questions and to comment on their areas of expertise. For example: How did they choose their careers? What are the best and worst things about your job? What is the biggest challenge facing your business today? What is it like to be a small business owner or entrepreneur? What career paths offer the best opportunities?

However, Greg emphasized that a career is only one component of creating a life that you love. His model shows that there are eight steps in one's "personal alignment", that help create a fulfilling life with a career/job as only one of those steps.

Following the conclusion of the Q&A session, Greg presented each member of the Interact Club a copy of a book on careers, Mission Possible, to which Greg is a contributor. The club is grateful to Greg for his ongoing commitment to Career Day and his insightful and timely advice!

AMBASSADORIAL SCHOLAR CANDIDATE VISITS CLUB



Washington, D.C. She desires to become an Ambassadorial Scholar and study energy issues, alternate energy sources and analyze global needs and international responses to the ever increasing demands on energy.

Ambassadorial Scholarships, The Rotary Foundation's oldest and best-known program, was founded in 1947. Since then, more than 40,000 men and women from about 100 nations have studied abroad under its auspices. Today it is one of the world's largest privately funded international scholarships programs. Nearly 700 scholarships were awarded for study in 2009-10. Through grants totaling approximately US\$16.2 million, recipients from about 70 countries studied in more than 80 nations.

"The Rotary Foundation does some terrific things, not the least of which is the Ambassadorial Scholarships program." — Michael R. Whiteman, international programs director, University of Idaho. The purpose of the Ambassadorial Scholarships program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries and geographical areas. The program sponsors academic year scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students as well as for qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as goodwill ambassadors to the host country and give presentations about their homelands to Rotary clubs and other groups. Upon returning home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that led to a greater understanding of their host country.

Generous contributions from Rotarians worldwide represent a continued faith that today's Ambassadorial Scholars will be tomorrow's community and world leaders.

THE 4-WAY TEST

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The 4-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test asks:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
