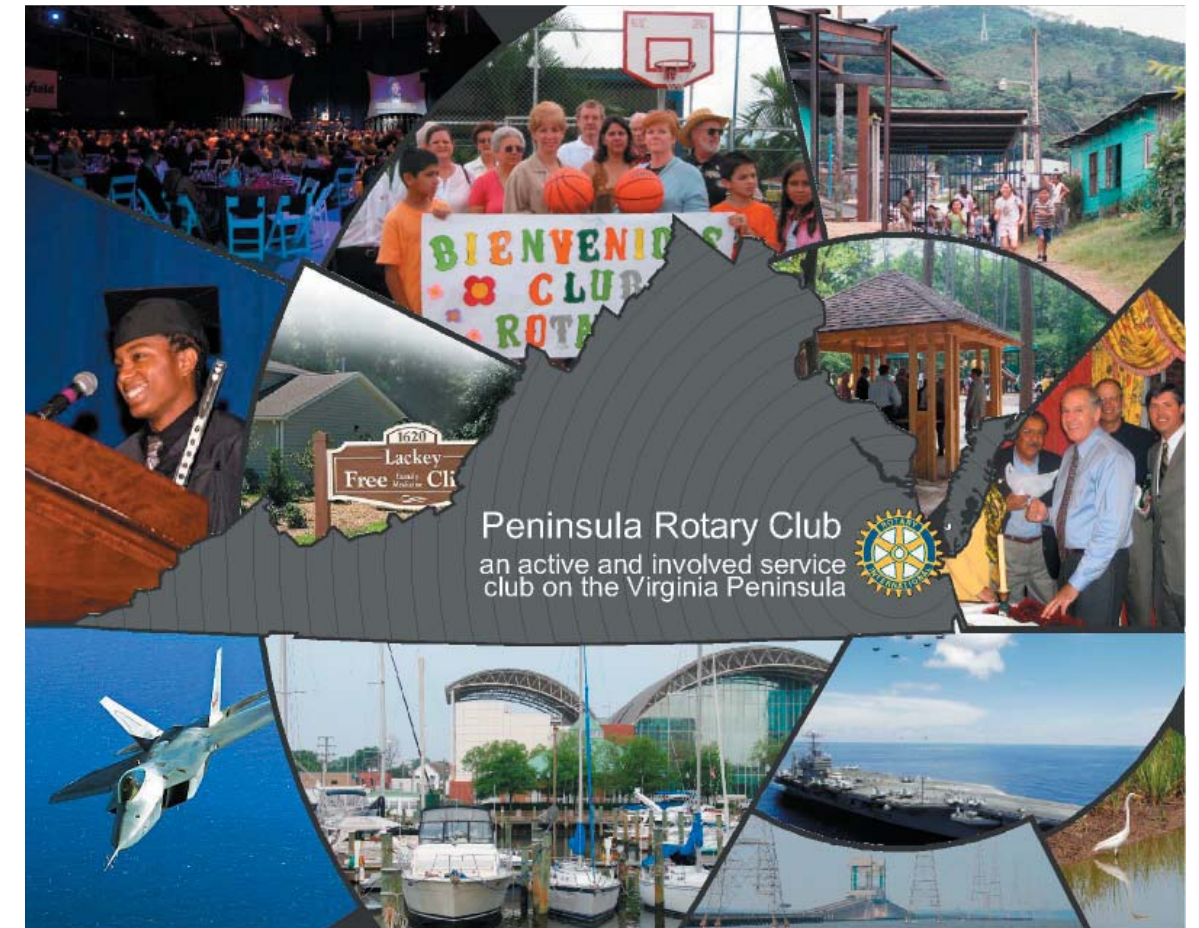

## Peninsula Rotarians say "Magnifique" to Montreal RI Convention

THE CONVENTION: There were 22,000 Rotarians at the four-day event. They came from all over the world, as could be seen with only a quick glance at the immense variety of clothing worn. Plenary sessions, addressing the entire convention, were held in a huge arena. Breakout sessions and other specialized events were held in an equally huge convention center.



THE CITY: The official language of Montreal is French as defined by the city's charter; the second largest primarily French-speaking city in the world, after Paris. Montreal has vitality, deep history, excellent resources, great cultural

variety, and its own mountain in the middle. What makes Montreal one of the world's truly great cities? It starts with its location. The island sits at the confluence of three rivers: the mighty St. Lawrence, the Rivière des Prairies and the Ottawa. In spite of its size, the city is as clean and neat as a small town. In the evenings in the residential neighborhoods it is quiet, and you see few automobiles but many bicycles.



THE PENINSULA CLUB IN MONTREAL: Our club presented its Carmen Lyra project in a 90-minute breakout session. Of a total of 51 breakout sessions at the convention, it was the only one that presented in detail a single international project, and about 120 Rotarians attended. Jim Pierce was the moderator and gave an introduction from the perspective of the global need for clean water, Ray

Spencer spoke about the project's history and how it came to fruition, John Frantz talked from the point of view of a physician, Philippe D'Eaubonne from our partner club in Costa Rica gave technical details of what was accomplished, Diane Hagemann elaborated on the mechanics of the Rotary Matching Grant that provided funding, and Cap Neilson spoke of the friendship between the Peninsula Club and its Costa Rican partner, the Escazú Club. There was lively interest from the audience, and the dialogue continued until we had to make way for the next group needing to use the room.
